What are the FAST Assessments?

- Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) is a progress monitoring system that is administered three times per year to track your student's progress in learning the Benchmarks of Excellent Student Thinking (B.E.S.T.) Standards throughout this school year.
- Information from the assessment is used to drive student instruction and course recommendations (Middle School)
- End-of-Course (EOC) assessments are not part of FAST.

ELA Writing

- In 2022–23, Writing will be administered as a field test to a representative sample of Florida students during the spring 2023 administration.
- **PVA will not be participating this year.**
- The first operational Writing Assessment will be administered in Spring 2024.

****Grade 3 ELA****

- Per F.S. 1008.22(5)(b), **to be promoted** to grade 4, a student **must score a Level 2 or higher** on the Grade 3 ELA.
- Students who score a Level 1 on ELA **may qualify for a good cause exemption** for promotion to Grade 4 per Florida State Board Rule 6A-1.094221(1)(A), F.A.C.

Grade 3 ELA

➤ 'Good Cause' Exemption Examples...

- Passing score on STAR reading assessment
- Passing score on SAT 10 by end of the school year
- Passing score on SAT 10 following district's **Summer Reading Program**
- Student portfolio of 3rd grade 'mini assessments' demonstrating proficiency

 - *Students who are still working at the end of the allotted time for the session may continue working up to the length of a typical school day

Statewide Science Assessment (SSA) – 5th & 8th Grade ONLY






- **Grade 5 Science sessions are administered over two days.**
 - Two 80-minute sessions
 - Paper-Based
- **Grade 8 Science sessions are administered in one day.**
 - Two 80-minute sessions
 - Paper-Based

FAST Scores and Performance Levels

- Students will receive a Scaled Score (SS): These levels are from the 21-22 performance scale. New achievement levels for F.A.S.T. will be available after Summer 2023.
- This last administration will provide a summative score that will accurately measure student mastery of the B.E.S.T. Standards at the end of the school year.
- ***Scores are expected to be uploaded into the F.A.S.T portal within one week of testing. Level 3 indicates on-grade-level performance.***

How are FAST Results Used?

- FAST results are used as an accountability tool for Districts and School Grades
- FAST results provide teachers and schools with additional information about each student's proficiencies.
- Results are used **IN ADDITION TO** teacher observations and performance throughout the year in making determinations of student strengths and areas of opportunity, as well as course placement.

How do we help your student prepare?

- Common assessments and practice tests to set format and content expectations

- Help your child realize this is not a test you can study for. However, it is very important they do their best every day leading up to and on the FAST test days
- Your child can participate in the practice tests so that he/she becomes familiar with the items
- Help your child get a good night sleep and eat a nutritious breakfast
- Provide emotional and positive support
 - Talk to your child and encourage them
 - Work with your child to help them learn how to lower anxiety/stress about the test
- Arrive to school every day – attendance is crucial

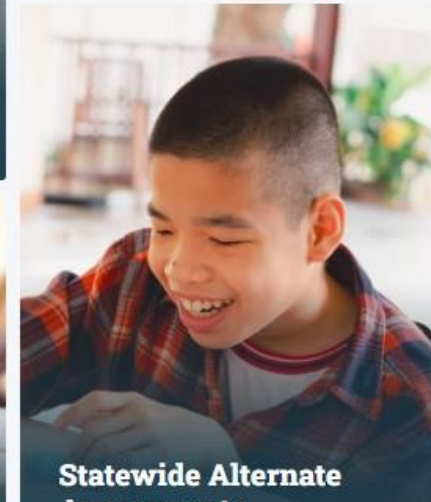
