Student Computer Recommended Specifications:

The **minimum** recommended specifications for a student laptop computer to support Distance Learning are shown below.

For grades K-8:

- Čeleron N4000 Processor or Intel iSeries Processor (i3/i5)
- 8 GB of RAM
- 64 GB HD
- Integrated Webcam

Optional Equipment for Distance Learning:

- Headphones with a microphone. Check to see that headphones fit, are comfortable for long term use, and fit in the computer's adaptor.
- A mouse. Finger tracking can be hard for some students.
- Blue light blocking glasses can help with prolonged screen time.
- A printer. Helpful for printing resource's and assignments.

Recommended Learning Environment:

- An organized and quiet space to study and work.
- Be able to monitor your student's screen.
- Set rules for online usage and video conferencing.
 - Example: Certain areas of the house are "off limits" (ie. bedroom or bathroom), conferencing done with parent supervision only, etc.
- Review cyber safety rules.
