Illness Guidelines: In an effort to reduce the spread of illness, please keep your child home if he/she is not feeling well. Our webpage has some checklist tools for guidance in determining if your child is appropriate for school.

A good day of rest at the beginning of illness can set your child up for a faster, healthier recovery.

HEALTH SCREENINGS

Palm Valley Academy will be offering limited free screening for vision, hearing and height/weight measurement for growth and development to students in Kindergarten, First, Third and Sixth Grades. Registered nurses, in conjunction with school personnel and trained volunteers, will assist with this screening. In addition, the sixth grade is given a scoliosis exam. If you DO NOT want your child screened, you must notify us in writing on the form sent home from school or visit our webpage to print a new Health Screening letter, complete and send to school in an envelope to the attention "School Nurse". Students in Kindergarten, First, Third and Sixth Grades may be selected for screening unless this form is received in the clinic by January 22, 2021. Distance students; please contact the school if you would like to set up an appointment with the clinic.

Elementary Parents

A Please remember that the only car drop off for PVA occurs through the car line. Cars should not drop off or pick up students from the side streets in the Crossing.  - Interviews with people who can assist them should they encounter situations beyond their control







- All funds default to PVA. If you choose to have your funds go to the new school MM, you will need to change your student's last name to read: "MM Lastname" i.e. MM Richardson or MM Chiodo, etc.
- You can easily make this change on your Parent Dashboard at anytime before **3/1/2021** by clicking on the yellow box that reads "Edit Webpage".
- Just make sure you enter your student's last name as MM Lastname. For example:

Student's First Name: Cole

Student's Last Name: MM Crouch


