HEALTH SCREENINGS

Palm Valley Academy will be offering limited free screening for vision, hearing and height/weight measurement for growth and development to students in Kindergarten, First, Third and Sixth Grades. Registered nurses, in conjunction with school personnel and trained volunteers, will assist with this screening. In addition, the sixth grade is given a scoliosis exam. If you DO NOT want your child screened, you must notify us in writing on the form sent home from school or visit our webpage to print a new Health Screening letter, complete and send to school in an envelope to the attention "School Nurse". Students in Kindergarten, First, Third and Sixth Grades may be selected for screening unless this form is received in the clinic by January 22, 2021. Distance students; please contact the school if you would like to set up an appointment with the clinic.



Rainy Day Dismissal

RAINY DAY DISMISSAL PROCEDURES

2020 - 2021

RAINY DAY HOLD vs. RELEASE

What you need to know...

Rainy day dismissals require an all-hands on deck approach, in which we will all need to work diligently to ensure students get home safe and sound. This is not an ideal dismissal scenario, but by working together, all students will get home as safely and quickly as possible. We appreciate your patience and support as we work to accomplish this feat.

There are TWO different types of Rainy Day Dismissals that we will use at PVA. One for passing weather and another for severe, sustained weather. Depending on local skies, administration will make the call to do one or the other by 2:30 p.m. if necessary. A school messenger will be sent out announcing the dismissal changes (BE SURE YOU ARE SIGNED UP AND RECIEVEING TEXT ALERTS VIA SCHOOL MESSENGER). Please read and become familiar with BOTH types of Rainy Day Dismissals and prepare as necessary.

RAINY DAY HOLD:

A Rainy Day HOLD will be called when inclement weather is in the area but looks to be quickly passing. If this is called, all bridge goers will be held within the building. Once the weather lightens and it is safe for student travel, the hold will be lifted and students will be able to <u>dismiss as normal</u>. In a HOLD, students will go home as planned, they will just be delayed. A school messenger will be communicated to parents both when the Rainy Day HOLD is placed and when it is lifted. No check-outs will occur at this time.

RAINY DAY RELEASE:

A Rainy Day RELEASE will be called when inclement weather is in the area and looks to be long lasting. If this is announced, all BIKER/WALKER/GOLF CART students will be held within the building and EVERYONE will become a car rider. The bridge gates will remain locked and closed, as NO walk-up check-outs will be allowed. A school messenger will be communicated to parents when a Rainy Day RELEASE is announced (no later than 2:30 p.m.) so arrangements can be made for student pick-up. AGAIN, THERE WILL BE NO BRIDGE ACCESS WHEN A RAINY DAY RELEASE IS CALLED AND ALL STUDENTS WILL BE CAR RIDERS. Please make sure you have your students name and grade level on your dashboard, along with your ID.

In the event of Rainy Day Hold or Release, please be attentive to all School Messenger alerts and messages

Quarantine Guidelines

Quarantine Information and FAQ for Parents

St John's Department of Health 904-506-6081

Quarantine Information: The CDC has released new guidelines regarding quarantine time frames for asymptomatic close contacts. Although 14 days is considered the gold standard, there are options for close contacts to end quarantine earlier than 14 days.

Option 1: NO TESTING- 10-day guarantine

If asymptomatic, your student may end quarantine after completion of day 10 and <u>return to</u> <u>school on day 11</u>. The Department of Health will confirm your student's return to school date with you during their initial phone call.

- It is extremely important that the contact continue daily monitoring for signs and symptoms through 14 days.
- Clearance to return on day 11 is <u>not</u> required. You may send your student to school if they are asymptomatic.

Option 2: PCR TEST on Day 6 or later

If an asymptomatic close contact gets tested by polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test on DAY 6 or later and receives a negative result, he/she may end quarantine after completion of day 7 and **return to school on day 8 with DOH clearance.**

- A rapid antigen test CANNOT be substituted.
- Note: PCR test results are averaging 3-5 days.
- Make sure results can be provided within 24 to 48 hours. If the results are likely to take longer than 48 hours, it may be better to quarantine through day 10 and return to school on day 11, if no symptoms.
- CHILDREN WITH A KNOWN PENDING TEST RESULT CANNOT RETURN TO SCHOOL.

If my student has a negative PCR test result, obtained on or after day 6 following exposure, what is the next step?

- Contact the St. Johns County Department of Health at (904) 506-6081
- The Department of Health (DOH) will review the case and will notify you and the school if your student is allowed to return early.
- If you were notified of a negative result, but it is not reflected in the DOH system, a copy
 of the result must be provided directly to the Department of Health. The school nurse
 cannot accept copies of negative PCR lab results as clearance to return.
- Clearance to return to school earlier than day 11 can only be given by the Department of Health.

Frequently Asked Questions:

My student has a pending COVID-19 test. Can I send them to school?

 No, keep your student home until you have received their results. If they are in quarantine, contact the Department of Health for early clearance.

My student has symptoms of COVID-19. What do I do?

 Please keep your student home from school. Contact your pediatrician, follow their advice regarding testing, treatment and returning to school.

My student or someone in the household tested positive for COVID-19. What do I do?

- If you haven't already done so, please contact the St. Johns County Department of Health and press option 8.
- Next, please contact Nurse Alice and Nurse Kara at Palm Valley Academy at (904)547-4221 or by email.

- · Please contact your student's teacher
- Please pick up your student/any siblings if in school
- Begin Isolation. Isolation keeps someone who tested positive for COVID-19 away from others, even in the same home.
- Begin Quarantine of close contacts in the household.

Who determines what day my student can return to school?

- The St Johns County Department of Health (DOH) determines what day your student may return to school.
- . The school follows the return dates given by the DOH.

How are the Isolation and Quarantine days counted?

- <u>COVID-19 positive individuals</u>: start of symptoms or test date (whichever comes first) is considered day 0.
 - Isolation continues through the 10th day.
- Close contacts to a COVID-19 positive individual: the day of the last known exposure is day 0.
 - o Quarantine continues through the 10th day if no symptoms are present.
 - o Student may return on the 11th day
 - Daily monitoring of symptoms must continue through day 14.

What makes someone a close contact?

- You are a close contact of a COVID-19 positive individual if, from 48 hours before their symptoms began, the person with COVID-19:
 - Lived in your home or stayed overnight with you
 - o Took care of you or you took care of them
 - Exposed you to their body fluids or secretions (coughed or sneezed on you)
 - Stayed within 6 feet of you for 15 minutes or longer
 - Close contacts in the school setting may include classroom, bus, extended day, etc.

How will I be notified if my student is identified as a potential close contact?

- If the exposure happened outside of school, you will be contacted by the Department of Health.
- If the exposure occurred in a school setting, you may be contacted by the school nurse or administration first and asked to pick up your child from school. The Department of Health will follow up with you within 24 hours to explain quarantine procedures and return to school.
- You will also receive an alert from School Messenger alerting you to an important email regarding your child and COVID-19. The email will have a statement from the district and a DOH letter explaining the situation.
- You might also be notified by someone you know that your student was in contact with a COVID-19 positive individual. If this happens, please notify the school nurse, pick up your student from school, and contact the DOH for guidance on quarantine.

If my student is quarantined, can they participate in other activities (sports, clubs, sleepovers, etc.)?

- Quarantine means staying home for 10 days, monitoring daily for 14 days.
- Your student can develop symptoms at any point in the 14-day period.

If my student is quarantined, does everyone in my household (siblings, spouse, etc.) need to quarantine?

No, if your student does not develop symptoms, no one else in the household is required
to quarantine. Members of the household would be considered "contacts of a contact"
and there are no CDC recommendations, as you are twice removed from the positive
individual.

Quarantine Information and FAQ for Parents

My student has been identified as a close contact with a COVID-19 positive individual, but has already had COVID-19 within the last 90 days. Do I still need to quarantine?

 Call the Department of Health, your student may not need to quarantine. They will be able to confirm any testing history.

How will this affect my student's attendance at school?

- · Students will be marked one of 2 ways
 - <u>"Present"</u> if they are participating from home per the guidelines and procedures set forth by the teacher(s).
 - o <u>"Excused absence"</u> if they are not participating from home per the guidelines and procedures set forth by the teacher(s). The student may be marked "unexcused" temporarily by the teacher, but these will be adjusted by the attendance clerk by the end of quarantine to "Excused".
 - Please give the attendance clerk until the end of the quarantine period to adjust attendance. If there continues to be any discrepancies, please contact <u>Kristen.Conway@stjohns.k12.fl.us</u>.

If, during the student's quarantine due to an exposure, I take my student to get tested for COVID-19 and we receive a negative test result, can the student return to school?

 A negative PCR test will only clear a student for early return if the student is tested on day 6 or later. Results can only be verified by the DOH and they must call the school in order for the student to be cleared. Please refer to the first page for more clarification.




Media Center Fun!

Off to a Great Start!




