Kindergarten and new students register early!

Voluntary Pre-K: A child must be four years old on or before September 1st.

Kindergarten: A child must be five years old on or before September 1st.

First Grade: A child must be six years old on or before September 1st **AND** satisfy one of the following:

- Satisfactory completion of kindergarten in a Florida public school.
- Satisfactory completion of kindergarten in a non-public school.
- Previous attendance in an out-of-state school in which the student was admitted on the basis of age requirements established by the state of residency.

Registration Requirements:

- Proof of Residency.
- Proof of Immunization.
- Copy of Birth Certificate.
- Physical/Health Exam with in 12 months of enrollment.

Middle School PE Uniforms

Middle School Bobcat Families,

For the upcoming school year, the Middle School PE Department is reaching out with some information on new uniform/locker room procedures for the 21-22 school year. This applies to ALL students in 6th-8th grade who are participating in PE. Please read this email in its entirety for PE uniform pre-sale information, which will close July 16th.



Uniforms: With the protocols and guidelines surrounding COVID-19 changing we will be dressing out and going back to wearing a uniform for all PE classes. PVA has modified and streamlined the uniform choices from two years ago to make ordering, fitment and uniform selection easier. What does this mean? **The old PVA uniforms are no longer going to be used or acceptable as a dress out option.** Every student is required to purchase a **new uniform**. To adhere to our school's dress code policy, both girls and boys will be wearing unisex shirts and shorts. When selecting a uniform there are 2 shirt choices (a dry-fit and a cotton) and 1 short choice. Each piece is \$15. Students are only required to have 1 shirt and 1 pair of shorts; however you are free to purchase as many as you think your child will need.

Pre-orders: We are currently taking pre-orders for PE uniforms. Uniform purchases can be done on School Pay prior to the school year starting. We will be distributing pre-ordered uniforms the first week of school. **Uniform pre-orders will close July 16th.** We ask that you pre-order your child's uniform to ensure they have the size requested. If you choose to purchase a uniform once the school year starts, sizes will be on a first come first serve basis (as uniforms will be ordered in bulk before school starts). SJCSD Health and Safety Procedures

May 14, 2020

Dear St. Johns County Schools parents and community members,

I would like to thank every family associated with the SJC school district this year. This has been a unique and challenging school year. We are in the final four weeks of the year and your support has been critical to the success students have experienced. We still have numerous high stakes assessments to administer and feel that it is imperative that we maintain our expectations and way of work until the last day of school on June 10.

We are all fatigued from the experience of the pandemic and staff members have worked tirelessly to support children in our schools. Throughout this public health crisis, we have utilized guidance and recommendations of federal, state, and local public health agencies. As we continue to follow the guidance of the CDC, I would like to share our intent moving forward so that families are informed about the school health and safety protocols for this summer and next school year.

Beginning with summer programs on June 14 and going into the 2021-2022 school year, the SJCSD will transition to the following health and safety procedures:

- **Face masks will be recommended, but optional in school and on SJCSD transportation**
- **Desk shields will no longer be a mandatory feature of all classrooms but will be used as appropriate when needed for health and safety protection or instructional/assessment purposes**
- **Temperature checks will no longer be a daily routine when students, staff or visitors arrive at school**
- **Enhanced sanitation practices will continue in our facilities to ensure clean, healthy schools**
- **Athletics, events, plays/performances, and dances will occur next school year. Protocols will be adjusted as we receive guidance from FHSAA and other state and local agencies.**

We will maintain these procedures barring any future emergency orders or crisis events. Again, thank you for your continued support this school year.

eSchoolPLUS Family Mobile App

The St. Johns County School District (SJCS D) has recently implemented the eSchoolPLUS Family Mobile App for parents/guardians. This mobile app allows parents to see many of the Home Access Center (HAC) features from their mobile phone. This application uses the same login credentials as Home Access Center (HAC).

In addition, we discovered that some parents were using other untrusted 3rd party mobile apps to provide similar data pulled from our system by providing them with their personal HAC credentials. This can be dangerous because, the District has no connection or affiliation with these other vendor apps. By providing them with your credentials, you have granted them access to your child's personal academic data. If this is the case, we recommend you remove the 3rd party app from your phone and then change your password in HAC. Then download and use the new eSchoolPLUS Family app (shown above).

If your student has medication in the clinic: Please make time to stop by to pick it up before the end of the school year. District policy does not allow for medication to remain in the school over the summer. It will be important for you to make arrangements to pick up your child's medication since medications may not go home with the student. Any medication left in the clinic after Friday, June 11th at 11:00 a.m. will be discarded according to district policy.

Paperwork for next year: New medication orders must be completed every school year. Medical paperwork is standardized across the St. John's District. Whether you are attending PVA, Pine Island Academy or any of our high schools, medical forms can be downloaded from the PVA Health Clinic Page (see link above). If your child has a physical examination during the summer months, this is a good time to get the medication forms completed.

Thank you to the many 8th graders who volunteered to learn Hands-Only CPR in May.

This nationwide campaign by the American Heart Association is an opportunity for anyone to train to become a hero. Hands-Only CPR focuses on building confidence to implement vital, yet simple first steps when an emergency arises.

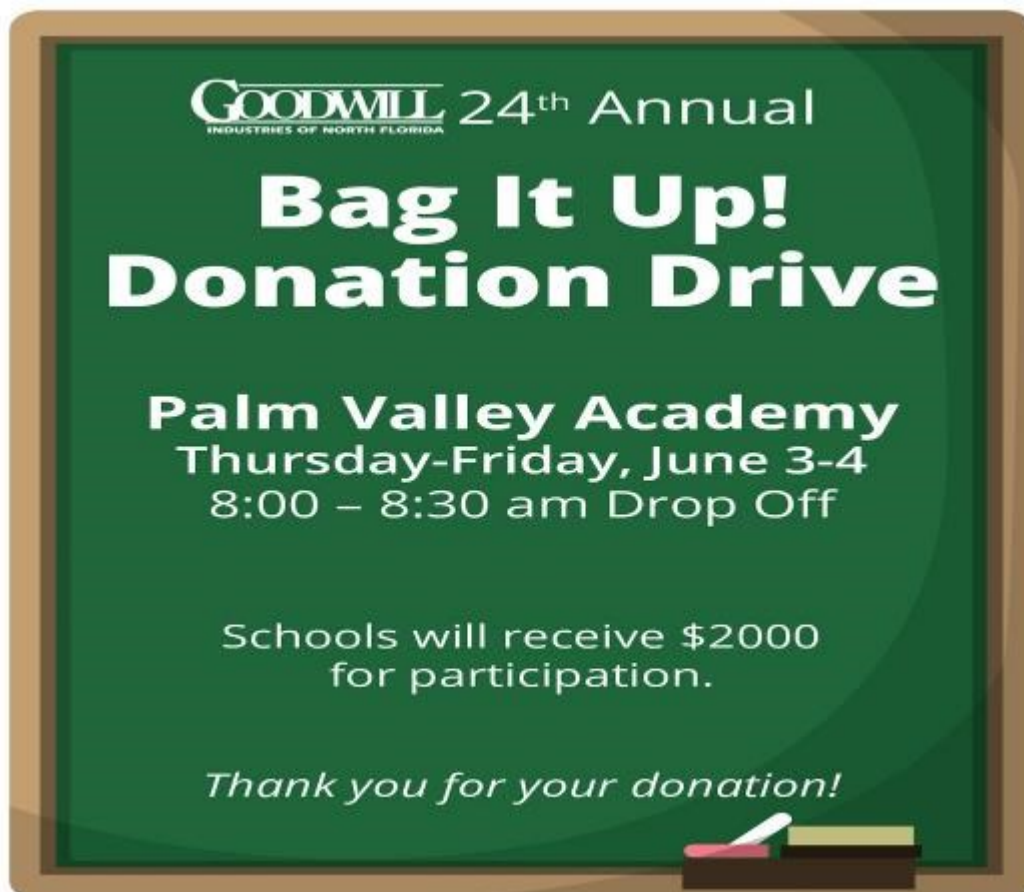
Attention 6th Grade Parents

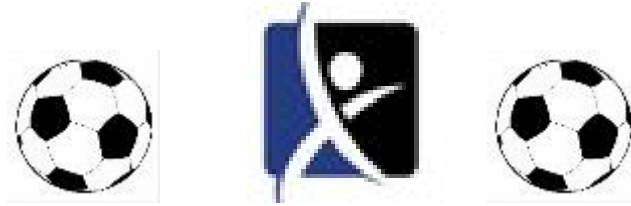

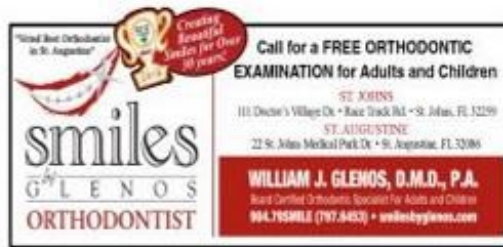
