# Guide to Teaching the Pillar of Fairness at Home

Play by the rules • Take turns and share • Be open-minded • Listen to others • Don't take advantage of others • Don't blame others carelessly

Dear Parents and Families,

This month we are focusing on the Character Counts Pillar of Fairness. Our district believes that every child has the potential to be fair and open-minded. We will do all that we can to promote this pillar, but we need your help! Below is a list of ideas to work through with your family!

#### what (an you do at home?

- The Key to Fairness: Pre-established rules, consistently applied.
- When you hear, "It's not fair!" ask your child to define what is unfair about the situation. Usually when you
  hear this, it means your child didn't receive something he/she thinks was deserved or an expectation hasn't
  been met-whether real or imagined.
- Discuss the question "Does fair mean equal?" with your child. Talk about situations in school, home or the community where the answers may sometimes be "yes" and sometimes "no".
- Set family goals. Have each member of the family complete the following sentence and post it where it will serve as a reminder: I will show fairness by \_\_\_\_\_\_.
- Create a democratic family environment by providing opportunities for each family member to provide input on appropriate family topics and decisions.
- · Embrace the uniqueness of each family member without making comparisons of specific areas of competence.
- Consistently apply pre-determined rules. Make expectations clear and predictable.
- · Advocate and help others who are impacted by adversity.
- Involve children in developing rules they are to follow.
- Focus Area: Music, whether on the radio or CDs, can be a wonderful source of entertainment and education. As a parent, you need to be clear about your rules and expectations regarding what is appropriate music for your child. With upper elementary through high school youth, you need to listen to what they are listening to, review the lyrics and discuss the character of the artists. Music videos can be highly suggestive and sometimes inappropriate for young viewers. Your role as a parent is to monitor what your child is viewing and listening to, and then determine if the lessons being taught through music are the ones that match the values you want your child to have. # **Electronic Contact Information Release Form**




This year, the electronic contact information release form will be completed online (if you didn't complete hard copy at Meet the Teacher).

## **Checklist for students with medical needs:**

<u>New medical diagnosis, needs or alerts?</u> It is important that the school have up to date medical information. If you need to add anything to your student's health record, please send in a written note ("Attention: School Nurse") to be placed with your student's file.

#### Need to leave medication at school?

- 1. Download any forms from the PVA "Health Clinic" department webpage
- 2. Bring the forms in to your pediatrician. A parent *and* doctor must sign the forms for them to be valid.
- Medications must be in their original container with a readable pharmacy/consumer label, unopened and unexpired. Please see our Medication Policy on the website for any further questions.

**Dropping off supplies and medication?** Bring your orders and supplies to the school during office hours to briefly meet with a nurse.

**Reminder:** It is a violation of the Student Code of Conduct for children to be carrying any medication (prescription or over the counter) with them at school without proper documentation. All medication must have a doctor's order on file in the clinic. Middle schoolers may carry over the counter medication *only with a signed form by the parent on file in the clinic*. Any violations will be brought up to Administration. Medication forms and more information can be found on the PVA Clinic Website.

### **Change of Clothing for Elementary Students:**

Accidents happen! Food spills, mud puddles, and more.



#### Student Health Screening Entry Form

Parents: Please assess your child daily for the following symptoms and answer the contact questions.

If any answers are "yes", we ask that you keep you student home.

- Fever of 100.4 or higher
- Uncontrolled cough
- · Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Sore throat
- · Loss of sense of smell or taste
- Muscle aches
- · Vomiting or diarrhea
- Is your child currently awaiting COVID-19 test results?
- Does your child live in the same household with someone positive for COVID-19?
- Has your child had close contact with someone who in the past 14 days tested positive for COVID-19?

# RAINY DAY HOLD vs. RELEASE

#### What you need to know...

Rainy day dismissals require an all-hands on deck approach, in which we will all need to work diligently to ensure students get home safe and sound. This is not an ideal dismissal scenario, but by working together, all students will get home as safely and quickly as possible. We appreciate your patience and support as we work to accomplish this feat.

There are TWO different types of Rainy Day Dismissals that we will use at PVA. One for passing weather and another for severe, sustained weather. Depending on local skies, administration will make the call to do one or the other by 2:40 p.m. if necessary. A school messenger will be sent out announcing the dismissal changes (BE SURE YOU ARE SIGNED UP AND RECIEVEING TEXT ALERTS VIA SCHOOL MESSENGER). Please read and become familiar with BOTH types of Rainy Day Dismissals and prepare as necessary.

#### RAINY DAY HOLD:

A **Rainy Day HOLD** will be called when inclement weather is in the area but looks to be quickly passing. If this is called, all bridge goers will be held within the building. Once the weather lightens and it is safe for student travel, the hold will be lifted and students will be able to <u>dismiss as normal</u>. In a HOLD, students will go home as planned, they will just be **delayed**. A school messenger will be communicated to parents both when the Rainy Day HOLD is placed and when it is lifted. No check-outs will occur at this time.

#### RAINY DAY RELEASE:

A **Rainy Day RELEASE** will be called when inclement weather is in the area and looks to be long lasting. If this is announced, all BIKER/WALKER/GOLF CART students will be held within the building and **EVERYONE** will become a car rider. The bridge gates will remain locked and closed, as NO walk-up check-outs will be allowed. A school messenger will be communicated to parents when a Rainy Day RELEASE is announced (no later than 2:40 p.m.) so arrangements can be made for student pick-up. AGAIN, THERE WILL BE NO BRIDGE ACCESS WHEN A RAINY DAY RELEASE IS CALLED AND <u>ALL STUDENTS WILL BE CAR RIDERS</u>. Please make sure you have your students name and grade level on your dashboard, along with your ID.

#### \*In the event of Rainy Day Hold or Release, please be attentive to all School Messenger alerts and messages\*

IF THE WEATHER LOOKS TO BE PASSING, AT 3:10PM, THE HOLD WILL BE LIFTED AND ALL BRIDGE

TRAFFIC WILL BEGIN DISMISSAL, THANK YOU FOR YOUR PATIENCE.
