

Middle School Parents,

As we get closer to registering our 8th graders for high school, there will be events and opportunities to learn more about Career Academies, the IB program, and other Programs of Choice. Please visit <u>here</u> to see a timeline of what you can expect from the school district over the next several months.

In addition, during the second quarter, PVA counselors will speak with 8th

graders during classes about high school and credit requirements. Students will utilize an online program called Naviance and they can share their progress with you at home.

The online application Programs of Choice will be a lottery you can enter through HAC and instructions will be sent by the district. Please note that the Academies and Programs of Choice are all optional. Transportation is only provided to your zoned school. No lottery completion is required if you plan to attend Nease High School and do not wish to enter an Academy or the IB Program.

In early March, high school counselors will set up registration appointments at PVA with you and your child to review 9th grade classes.

PVA Bike Safety

LET'S WALK & ROLL SAFELY!

Parents, HELP teach kids to RIDE SAFE!

Encouraging our kids to walk or roll (bike, wheelchair, scooter, skateboard, etc.) to school is a good move in the right direction. When they get out of the car and walk, bike or roll, they learn valuable lessons about independence, plus get a healthy dose of exercise and fresh air. Dur neighborhoods benefit from fewer cars on the road and less congestion around school.

(I) Get Ready, Get Set...

Start in the right direction by showing them the way. Go on the route with your child. It's the best way to share the rules – not to mention a fun way to spend time together!

(2) Look for the Signs

Your child will need to recognize, remember and obey traffic signs, signals and pavement markings.

(3) Practice Safe Habits

Practice with your child by walking or rolling together. Repeated practice helps kids get better at it and you feel more comfortable with their skills.

(4) Iron Out the Best Route

Identify a safe route to and from school or the bus stop. The school may already have route maps with recommendations. If not, here are some considerations:

- Look for less busy roads and slower speeds.
- Choose crossing locations that have a clear view of traffic.
- · Practice the route with your child until you are both comfortable.
- If no sidewalks, choose roads w/ shoulders where people walking can face oncoming traffic.

Dear SJCSD Families,

As a result of COVID-19 pandemic, we are seeing nationwide disruptions to manufacturing, supply and distribution channels and it is impacting our school meal program. In short, we're having trouble getting foods, supplies and staff to support our program. Your student(s) may notice that we're serving different items than we've served in the past or different items than were listed on the menu. This situation is something that school districts across the country are experiencing. We are doing our best every day to come up with solutions to these challenges.

To reduce the demand on our supply chain and accommodate current staffing levels, the St. Johns County School District will **return to normal food service operations on Wednesday, December 1, 2021**. Students who qualify for free or reduced meals based on direct certification or a family income application will continue to receive meals at no or reduced costs. Students who are not eligible based on income will return to a **PAID status**.

Beginning today, October 25 through Tuesday, November 30, families are encouraged to complete the family lunch application if they feel they qualify for free or reduced cost meals. Applications are located on the SJCSD Website at <u>https://www.stjohns.k12.fl.us/food/free/</u>, your student's school or the Food and Nutrition Services Office located at 3015 Lewis Speedway, Building 7, St. Augustine, FL 32084. Eligibility status is protected by very strict disclosure regulations. Students use a PIN or Student ID in the serving line. The student's eligibility is private throughout the transaction.

If your student(s) attend(s) a Community Eligibility Program School, there is no need to complete an application. All students will continue to receive no cost meals through the end of the school year. These schools are as follows: Webster Elementary, Crookshank Elementary, Osceola Elementary, South Woods Elementary, Mason Elementary, The Transitions School, Gamble Rogers Middle School, Murray Middle School, Sebastian Middle School and St. Johns Technical High School.

While there may be some menu changes, please know that we will strive to meet nutrition guidelines set by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). We will also continue to accommodate students with special diets and allergies. We appreciate your patience and understanding. 
