

MIDDLE SCHOOL NEWS

Middle School Parents,

As we get closer to registering our 8th graders for high school, there will be events and opportunities to learn more about Career Academies, the IB program, and other Programs of Choice.

Please visit here to see a timeline of what you can expect from the school district over the next several months.

In addition, during the second quarter, I will speak with 8th graders during classes about high school and credit requirements. Students will utilize an online program called Naviance and they can share their progress with you at home.

The online application Programs of Choice will be a lottery opening you can enter through HAC and instructions will be sent by the district. Please note that the Academies and Programs of Choice are all optional. Transportation is only provided to your zoned school. No lottery completion is required if you plan to attend Nease High School and do not wish to enter an Academy or the IB Program.

In early March, high school counselors will set up registration appointments at PVA with you and your child to review 9th grade classes.



Middle School Art in the Capitol Contest

It's time of year when one of our middle school student artists have a chance to shine in the Capitol Building in Tallahassee, Florida!

Middle Schools, K-8 Academies, public, and private schools may submit up to three (3) entries. Grade 6-8 students who are home schooled may submit one entry. The process for selecting artwork at individual schools shall be determined by each school. The artwork will need to be submitted to the Office of Curriculum and Instruction with attention to K-12 Fine Arts Program Specialist, Antonio C. Scott no later than Thursday, December 1, 2022, for judging by an independent panel.

One piece will be chosen to represent our school district in the Capitol in Tallahassee. The winning art selection must be submitted to our State Representative no later than **January 7**, 2023, to be displayed during the regular legislative session, which begins on **March 7**, 2023. Artwork will be returned at the end of the legislative session which is scheduled for **May 5**, 2023.

There is no theme, matting or framing requirement however, all artwork must

- be two-dimensional;
- not exceed 28 inches wide by 28 inches long by 4 inches thick;
- be original in concept, design, execution and not violate copyright laws;
- include student's name, grade, district, school name and city.

Although there is no cash prize or award from the state for contest winners, the winning student artist will receive a letter of recognition from the capitol along with the honor of having their work on display during the legislative session. Additionally, a first, second and third place certificate along with a letter of acknowledgement will be awarded from the St John's County School District.


