



The Family Portal provides a central location for your student's assessment results.

The Family Portal can be used to

- access your student's results for FAST Progress Monitoring testing.
- access prior statewide assessment results.
- print score reports.

How can I access the Family Portal?

- At the Florida Statewide Assessments Portal: https://fifast.org
- Or at the direct link: https://fl-familyportal.cambiumast.com/

What information do I need to log in to the Family Portal?

- Your student's unique 6-digit access code (found in HAC under the Registration tab).
- Your student's date of birth.
- Your student's first name as it appears on their official school record.

What information can I find on the Family Portal?

- Your student's results from Fall 2020 through present
- Your student's Individual Student Reports with interpretative guides.
- Glossary
- FAQs
- Performance Levels

Where do I get the Access Code?

The code can be found in the Home Access Center (HAC) under the Registration tab. The code will be located on the right side of the page under Additional Information.

6th GRADE PARENTS

The Tdap immunization is required for all 7th graders.

Proof of this immunization on the DH 680 Form can be brought to the front office, faxed (904-547-4205), or emailed to (Mary.Dominguez@stjohns.k12.fl.us even if your student is still in 6th grade. Please do this as soon as your child receives their shot.

Per district policy, all 7th grade students are required to submit an updated DH 680 form to include Tdap, prior to the start of 7th grade.

Hello 8th Grade Parents!

Ticket details:

- Ticket reservations begin Monday, April 29. An email with the ticket reservation link will be sent directly to parents/guardians by the school.
- Each student is allotted 3 tickets to reserve. You do not have to reserve all 3. Children <2 yrs. old
 do not require a ticket but <u>must</u> sit in a lap. Initial ticket reservations must be made by May 10th
 at midnight.
- If there are additional tickets available, families will be allowed to reserve 1 additional ticket (while supplies last) beginning May 15. Details on the reservation process for any additional tickets will be sent on that date. Additional tickets are very limited and NOT guaranteed.
- All ticket reservations close May 17 at midnight.
- There is no cost for tickets.
- Transfer of tickets between students is allowed; however, the party who is giving the ticket to someone else must email pva8graduation@gmail.com to notify the coordinators of the new recipient. Otherwise, the ticket count at check-in for each student will be incorrect and the intended party will not have their ticket.
- Information on how to reserve tickets is forthcoming. Just to reiterate, <u>ticket reservations do</u> not begin until April 29.
- Attire for this event is business casual/Sunday best.

If your student currently has medication in the clinic:

- Please sign up for a time to pick up your student's medication (use link or QR code):
 Palm Valley Academy Nursing Clinic: End of Year Medication
 Pick Up (signupgenius.com)
- District policy does not allow for medication to remain in the school over the summer. It will be important for you to plan to pick up your child's medication since medications may not go home with the student.
- Any medication left in the clinic after Friday, May 24th at 2:30 p.m. will have to be discarded according to district policy.



Paperwork for next year:

- New medication forms must be completed every school year. We will have paperwork for next year available when medication is picked up.
- Starting in June, medical forms can be downloaded from the PVA Health Clinic Page (see link above).
- Paperwork is standardized across all St John's County Schools should your student be transferring to high school or another district school. If your child has a physical examination during the summer months, this is a good time to get these medical forms completed.

**Please make sure to send a water bottle in with your student every day.

We suggest keeping a spare change of clothes in their backpack for any (fun, messy, wet) *End of Year Activities*.

May Testing: Make sure to catch your Zzzzz's

- · An overall improved mental and physical health.


Ways to help sleep at night:

SAFE SUMMER TIPS







MANY SUMMERTIME ACTIVITIES CARRY HEALTH RISKS FOR CHILDREN.
HELP THEM AVOID THESE HAZARDS WITH PRECAUTIONS.

BEAT BUGS



Protect against mosquitoes by keeping children indoors at dawn and dusk. Apply insect repellent with no more than 30% DEET.



Check for ticks in hair and skin after kids spend time outdoors. Have them wear pants, long-sleeve shirts, socks and shoes in woods or tall grass.



Get immediate medical attention for serious reactions to bee and wasp stings, such as hives, swelling in the throat, dizziness, nausea or difficulty breathing.

STOP SUNBURN AND HEAT SICKNESS



Slather kids with a water-resistant, broad-spectrum sunscreen with an SPF of at least 30.



Dress them in light, loosefitting clothes, wide-brimmed hats and sunglasses.



Make sure they drink water to stay hydrated.



Limit time outdoors when the sun's rays are strongest between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

SWIM SAFELY



Watch children at all times when they are in or near water.



Teach kids to swim or enroll them in swimming lessons.



If you have a pool, install a fence with a self-closing and self-latching gate.


Dear parents and caregivers,

They teach the importance of Attitude, Effort, and Character.


