A Message of Safety from Deputy Wilson (3 of 3)

Hey Parents and Friends of Bobcats everywhere! Please help us keep our students safe. As your school's assigned Deputy, I must ask that everyone please the protocols established for our campus and beyond. There is no perfect solution for everyone, but what is done helps us safely move well over a thousand students and staff, plus buses and cars each day. As a parent, I understand how hard it can be to balance life's daily challenges, but we must keep a safety-first mindset. If I can be of any assistance or need clarity on any topic, please let me know.

- E-bikes and scooters are being operated in a hazardous manner. They are
 too fast and hard to hear when they are overtaking walkers and other
 bikers. Before there is a serious injury, we would like to ask parents please
 remind or instruct your child on the proper operation and bicycle laws
 they must follow. On a multi-use pathway, pedestrians will have the right
 of way.
- Bicyclists, scooter and skateboard operators must wear a protective helmet at all times.
- Dress in brightly colored clothes to be seen easily when playing outdoors, especially in twilight or dusk.
- Golf cart pickup line etiquette... please do not bypass the line. If there's an emergency, make other arrangements.

National Child Passenger Safety Week (9/15-9/22)

Speaking of Child Safety, the NHTSA recommends the following for Child Passenger Seats:

- Birth 12 Months: Babies under age one should always ride in a rearfacing car seat. There are different types of rear-facing car seats: Infant-only seats can only be used rear-facing. Convertible and 3-in-1 car seats typically have higher height and weight limits for the rearfacing position, allowing you to keep your child rear-facing for a longer period of time.
- 1 3 Years: Toddlers should ride in a rear-facing car seat with a harness as long as possible – until they reach the seat's top height or weight limit, typically around 35 to 45 pounds.
- 4 7 Years: Young children should ride in a forward-facing car seat with a harness until they reach the seat's top height or weight limit typically between 40 and 60 pounds.
- 8 12 Years: Children should ride in a belt-positioning booster seat until
 they are at least 4 feet 9 inches tall. Seat belts fit properly when the lap
 belt lies snugly across the upper thighs, not the stomach, and the
 shoulder belt lies snug across the shoulder and chest, not over the neck
 or face.

Child Safety Seat Tips:

- The seat should be strapped in tight—you should not be able to move it more than one inch in any direction at the belt path. Always use the top tether when forward-facing.
- The chest clip should be at armpit level, and the harness should be snug—the straps should be tight enough that you cannot pinch the fabric of the harness at the shoulders.
- Children age 13 and under should ride in the back seat.
- Older children no longer need a special seat if their legs bend comfortably at the seat's edge with their back resting flat against the back of the seat.
