
Palm Valley Academy: Week of 1/27 - 2/1

A Note of Safety from Deputy Wilson

Hello Bobcats Families and Friends- I want to share some important safety tips this week, to help keep our students safe.

*Please inspect your child's helmets and replace if they have developed any cracks in the plastic or to the foam protection inside. Ideally a helmet should be replaced annually at minimum, because as children grow their helmet stops fitting properly. Heat can degrade the padding and strap materials, especially when they are stored outside, hanging on handlebars during the warm months.

*Scooters and e-bikes are an increasing source of injury. Spend some time reinforcing the proper operation and adjust the top speed of these devices if you can. We all know that young people like to operate at wide open throttle. However, at speeds of 15+ your kiddo can sustain serious injuries. Injuries can be exponentially greater if they are not wearing protective equipment.

*Rules of the road apply... please remind children they must follow the laws to include; stopping at intersections, yielding to pedestrians and when sharing the roadway, they must stay to the right while riding and on the left when walking.

If we all pitch in to do our part as a community and parents, we can ensure our Bobcats stay safe. All my best to you - Mark

Kicking off Kindness -

The WEB kids are excited to share that they have started a kindness campaign that will begin on January 27th. We have been working on making posters, a kindness calendar for at home activities, and creating videos to get ready. It has different challenges, but all have the same goal: to create a caring environment for the kids at PVA. We are very excited and can't wait for the plan to go into motion.

Our kindness campaign kicks off with a **Greeting Challenge**! The goal of this challenge is to encourage everyone to acknowledge one another with friendly greetings. It begins on **January 27th** and will "end" on **February 7th**.

The second challenge focuses on **Random Acts of Kindness** and runs from **February 10th through February 21st**. During this time, WEB leaders will hand out "Caught Being Kind" tickets to students who demonstrate simple but meaningful acts of kindness.

The final challenge, from **February 24th through March 7th**, encourages students to **compliment one another with "reckless abandon"**—spreading positivity and lifting each other with kind words. We will be creating a kindness tree filled with compliments and messages of gratitude. We are especially excited to visit elementary classrooms to share more about this kindness campaign and complete a fun activity with them.

When the kindness campaign is over, our goal is that the students will continue to take on the responsibility of spreading kindness around our school community resulting in a caring and inclusive environment for all.

As part of the campaign, we are encouraging students to spread kindness at home, in school, and in the community. Below (and also listed as an attachment), you'll find a **Kindness Challenge Calendar** created by WEB leaders, filled with voluntary daily activities your student may wish to complete.

Here's how it works:

- 1. Each day, encourage your child to complete the kindness activity listed on the calendar.
- 2. Once the activity is complete, please sign the calendar for that day.
- 3. At the end of the month, students can return their completed and signed calendars to school to earn **PBIS points** as a reward for their efforts!

This challenge is a wonderful way to reinforce positive behaviors and celebrate the power of kindness together. Calendars will be sent home with students on Monday. Thank you for partnering with us to make this a meaningful experience for your child and our school community!


