
The cutoff time for early pick-up from the front office is 2:15 p.m. (Wed.-1:15 p.m.)

DID YOU KNOW!?! ATTENDANCE FACTS

- ✓ Good attendance is missing not more than 1 day of school a month, whether excused or unexcused. Chronically absent is when you miss 18 days of school a year or 2 days a month.
- ✓ <u>Students with good attendance: Read better, Have higher GPAs, and Will be on track for</u> high school graduation.
 - ✓ Poorer student performance due to absenteeism begins as early as kindergarten and extends across grades, creating a cumulative effect.
- ✓ Ensuring regular attendance is one of the best things a parent can do to ensure their child's success in school and life.



Building PRIDE and Character the PVA WAY!

January is a wonderful time for setting goals and reinforcing positive habits, and here at PVA, we are doing just that through our PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports) program.

PBIS is a proactive approach to creating a positive school climate by teaching and reinforcing appropriate behaviors. The program focuses on setting clear expectations for students, acknowledging and rewarding positive behavior, and providing support when challenges arise. By working together, we aim to create a safe and respectful environment where all students can thrive academically and socially.

At Palm Valley Academy, our PBIS expectations are summed up in the acronym PRIDE:

- **P**: Prepared
- **R**: Respectful
- I: Inspired
- D: Determined
- **E**: Engaged

We encourage students to embody these values in all areas of their school experience, from the classroom to the playground.

PBIS/Character Counts! Character Trait of the Month: Respect

Each month, we recognize a character trait that is aligned to our PBIS program and the Character Counts! initiative, and January's focus is on respect. Respect is the foundation for healthy relationships and a supportive school community. This month, students will participate in activities and discussions that help them understand the importance of respecting themselves, others, and their environment.

Parents and guardians play a crucial role in fostering respectful behaviors. Here are some ways you can support this month's focus:

- 1. **Model Respect:** Demonstrate respectful behavior in your interactions with others. Children learn a great deal by observing adults.
- 2. **Practice Active Listening:** Encourage your child to listen attentively when others are speaking and to respond thoughtfully.
- 3. **Teach Manners:** Reinforce polite words and actions, such as saying "please," "thank you," and "excuse me."
- 4. **Celebrate Diversity:** Discuss the importance of respecting different opinions, cultures, and backgrounds.
- 5. **Set Expectations:** Clearly communicate what respectful behavior looks like at home and in public spaces.



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


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






















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
