#### An Amazing Opportunity for our 7th and 8th Graders, as well as ALL K-8 Parents

We are thrilled to share that we have an exciting opportunity for our students and school community! On 3/24, we will be welcoming John Halligan, a distinguished national speaker, to speak with our 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Students during the day and ALL parents in the evening about the impact of bullying, cyberbullying and youth mental health.

Mr. Halligan suffered the devastating loss of his son, Ryan, to suicide in 2003. Ryan was a victim of bullying both at his middle school and online. Since 2005, when he first shared his son's story, Mr. Halligan has spoken at over 2000 schools throughout the United States, Canada and Mexico, impacting more than 1 million students. His message is both inspiring and educational and directly aligns with our commitment to providing meaningful learning experiences that extend beyond the classroom.

We encourage all 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students to be present and engaged during this special event (permission slips MUST BE SUBMITTED BY END OF THIS WEEL), and we invite ALL K-8 COMMUNITY PARENTS/GUARDIANS to join the evening session with us if possible.

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






















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
