# Building a Culture Where Kindness Can Thrive, So Bullying Can't Survive

# Hate cannot drive out hate, only love can do that.

Dr. Martin Luther King Jr

Last week, our 8th grade WEB leaders collaborated with Darryll Sutherland from the district and high school students to present an anti-bullying message to our K-6 students. Hearing this message from others besides just PVA teachers, counselors and administrators can make the message more powerful and applicable.

Here are the 5 main points from the presentation. Using the same language at home and at school will help reinforce the kind culture we are trying to maintain here at PVA. Please ask your student about this message to see what they remember.

## Point 1 - Be Resilient. I can only control what I can control...which is me!

Accompanying hand signal = one finger pointing at others (can't control), three fingers pointing at me (can control)

- I can control my attitude/feelings
- I can control my effort
- I can control my choices/behaviors

# Point 2 - Create Peace

Accompanying hand signal = peace sign, two fingers in the air

- Follow the Golden Rule
  - Treat people the way YOU WANT to be treated.
  - Be kind to others even if others are not kind to you.

#### Point 3 - Guard Your Heart


- Think before you speak and act T.H.I.N.K. before you speak (is it True Helpful -Inspiring - Necessary - Kind?)
- Choose healthy friendships that are encouraging and positive.
- Choose healthy online/social media environments. If it turns toxic, leave the
  environment.
- Choose healthy in-person environments with appropriate activities.

#### Point 4 – Be a H.E.R.O.

- Have Empathy, Reach Out to help others.
- Include others that feel left out (be open to making new friends).
- Be an up-stander and stand up for others when you hear or see others being mean.

#### Point 5 – Get Help from a Trusted Adult

- If you see bullying occur, get help from an adult.
- This is not tattling or snitching... it's about getting help and keeping others safe.
- Telling other kids or friends is okay but they will not be able to solve the problem or help the same way as an adult. Get support from friends but still tell a trusted adult.



#### A Bike/Scooter Safety Initiative

A schoolwide Bike/Scooter Safety educational initiative was recently launched at PVA. Our school based team in partnership with **Wolfson Children's Hospital**, recently completed bike and e-bike safety presentations for our middle school students and they'll be pushing into elementary PE classes over the coming weeks to ensure our younger students also receive this critical instruction.

The presentations are tailored by age group and include real-life scenarios, student-led activities, visuals, and actionable takeaways—all designed to be impactful while age-appropriate. We've received extremely positive feedback so far from the kids, and we're hopeful that this partnership will continue to grow and reinforce the potential life-saving messages.



# Support Rigorous Academic & Career Programs for Our Students!

Thank you to everyone who has reached out to express interest in our district's advanced academic and career readiness programs. These programs have been the topic of much conversation over the past couple of weeks and I thought it necessary to provide you all with a little context to what they are and what they do for our students.

These valuable pathways—AICE, AP, IB, DE, and CTE—are available in many of our middle and high schools and are designed to provide rigorous academic opportunities, college-level coursework, and real-world skills.

Here's a quick overview:

# AICE (Advanced International Certificate of Education)

- Developed by Cambridge University
- Offers an internationally recognized pre-university curriculum
- Students may earn college credit and qualify for scholarships like Florida's Bright Futures

## AP (Advanced Placement)

- Administered by the College Board
- Provides college-level courses and exams in a variety of subjects
- High exam scores can lead to college credit or advanced placement

# IB (International Baccalaureate)

- A globally recognized program focused on academic rigor and global citizenship
- Emphasizes critical thinking, research, and service through the IB Diploma Program

# **DE (Dual Enrollment)**

- Allows high school students to take college courses
- Earns both high school and college credit—often tuition-free
- Offered in partnership with local colleges and universities

#### CTE (Career and Technical Education)

- Prepares students for future careers with hands-on, trade-specific learning
- Includes programs in health sciences, IT, culinary arts, engineering, and more
- Offers industry certifications and job readiness training

Each of these programs are tailored to meet the diverse interests and goals of our students—and your support helps them thrive.

Grocery Items Non-perishable food items (canned proteins like peanut butter or tuna, canned veggies and fruits, boxed meals, box potatoes, macaroni & cheese, jelly, cereal, pop tarts, kid's snacks

Baby/Kid Items Diapers (preferably size 3 and up) baby food and any type of formula, NEW children's underwear & socks

Linens: XL twin sheets, towels

Office Supplies- paper, pens & pencils, spiral notebooks, stamps

Cleaning Supplies- household cleaning supplies and paper products (paper plates, napkins, toilet paper, paper towels, plastic silverware
























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
