




## **IMPORTANT INFORMATION (FIRST COMMUNICATED 7/14)**

#### **Access to the School:**

Whether you are attending a conference with the teacher in person, volunteering in the classroom/events, escorting your kindergartener to class on their first official day of school, joining us for a presentation/celebration, and/or attending a field trip, you must have completed the **School Access Form: Volunteer Application**. This is a district policy and there are no exceptions. We truly do not like to turn families away, so please complete and submit the application by following the link:

## **Elementary Meet and Greet:**

This is your time to "Meet the Teacher" and get acquainted with the PVA campus. Please see the above staggered schedule to accommodate all families in our hallways and parking areas. During this event, students will walk the building, meet their teacher(s) and drop off any school supplies they'd like to bring. Representatives from Transportation, Food Service, School Clinic, Extended Day, and other areas of service will be onsite and available to answer questions.

#### Middle School Walk Your Schedule:

Middle school students and families are invited to visit the campus, pick up their class schedules, and walk through their day at their own pace. This is a great opportunity to locate classrooms, practice locker combinations, and get a feel for the flow of the school day before the first bell rings. Please note that teachers will not be available during this time, but staff will be on hand to help with directions and any general questions. An Important Legislative Update: K-8 Phone & Smart Watch "Away for the Day" Policy
Per Florida State Statute, students are no longer permitted to have cell phones or smart watches, that can communicate, during the instructional day. As a school, we will fully embrace an "Away for the Day" policy and know that our students will have more opportunities to just be a kid a little bit longer while reducing distractions during the instructional day. ## Additional PVA "Away for the Day" details:

- Student cell phones and/or smart watches must be "off and away" between 8:40-3:00 every day.
- Phones and/or smart watches may be out and used in the morning along with ONE earbud (8:20-8:40) and <u>then must either be locked and stored in lockers, in a backpack, or in a place that is secured during the school day (8:40-3:00)</u>.
- PVA is not responsible for lost or damaged items.
- Teachers and staff will remain consistent from class to class and <u>not allow students to use</u> <u>phones during the day</u>; laptops or iPads will be used during the instructional day if internet is needed for a lesson or activity.
- Students may not use their phones during class transitions or during lunch time.
- If a student is found using their devices, the following progression of support will be utilized:
  - <u>1st Offense</u>: Device confiscated and taken to front office for student to pick up at end of day and an appropriate consequence will be assigned.
  - <u>2<sup>nd</sup> Offense:</u> Device confiscated and taken to front office. Parent will be contacted to pick up device at end of day. Appropriate consequences will be assigned.
  - <u>3<sup>rd</sup> Offense:</u> Device confiscated and taken to front office. Parent will be contacted to pick up device at end of day. Appropriate consequences will be assigned.
